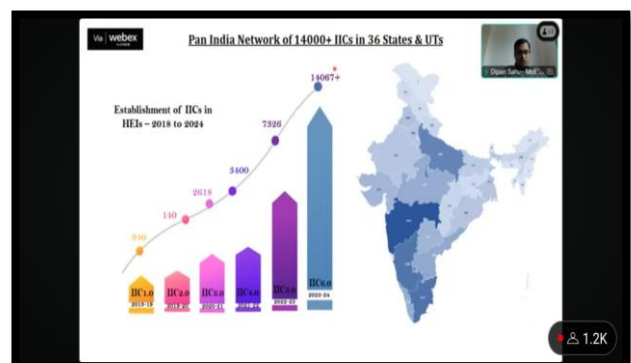
Academic courses

- These courses are skill development program like Short-term program, MDI, EDP & FDP of minimum 30 contact hours of duration.
